## Note from Sheri:

I just wanted to personally thank Jackie for submitting this pattern to be posted on my site. It was very gracious of her to offer it for free...thank you, Jackie! Please respect her copyright and use this pattern for personal use only.

Also note that the picture on the front is the earwarmer I knitted for my daughter's doll...from Jackie's pattern here. However, you will note a few differences: 1-My daughter wanted the pom poms by the bow, so instead of attaching them to the end of the bow ties, I attached one right at the bow. 2-She also wanted a bow on each side, so I made a bow (with pom pom) on each side! 3-I also did not attach pom poms to the ends of the ties that tie under the chin. I just tied a knot in the chain at the end. Part of my problem is that I have not made pom poms for a LONG time...and I couldn't get them small enough to look right...hence the "adjustment" to Jackie's pattern! This just shows that you can take a pattern and "make it your own".

# Newborn Baby's Ear Warmer

For the Baby's Ear Warmer you will need the following:

- ❖ 2 skeins of baby yarn color of your choice
- ❖ Size 2 knitting needles
- ❖ Crochet hook that matches the knitting needles that you are using.
- ❖ Pom Pom maker or cardboard for making 4 small pom poms (2 for the ends of the ties and 2 for decorating the bow on the side you made the yarn overs.)

Measure child's head from the tip of the right ear to the tip of the left ear. This will be the length that you will knit the "Middle Section" (from the end of the yarn overs to the beginning of casting off side).

## Casting On Row

Important Note: Before starting to knit, crochet a chain long enough to be one of the tie strings to tie under the chin.

Row 1: After crocheting a long enough chain, transfer the stitch to your knitting needle to begin knitting. This will be Row 1.

Row 2: Knit into your stitch and then place the new stitch onto the original needle. You will now have 2 stitches.

Row 3: Knit

Row 4: Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch You now have 3 stitches

Row 5: Knit

Row 6: Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. You now have 5 stitches

Row 7: Knit

Row 8: Knit 2 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 2 stitch. You now have 7 stitches

Row 9: Knit

Row 10: Knit 3 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 3 stitches. You now have 9 stitches

Row 11: Knit

Row 12: Knit 4 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 4 stitches. You now have 11 stitches

Row 13: Knit

Row 14: Knit 5 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 5 stitches. You now have 13 stitches

Row 15: Knit

Row 16: Knit 6 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 Stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 6 stitches. You now have 15 stitches

Row 17: Knit

Row 18: Knit 7 stitches. Yarn over. Knit 1 Stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 7 stitches You now have 17 stitches

### **Middle Section**

Knit the next section for the measurement that you made of the baby's head from ear to ear. You can either knit it straight (all knitting rows) or you can do a K1 P1 for the measurement of the baby's head. Make sure you end with a knit row.

### **Casting off Rows:**

Row 1: Knit 6 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 1 stitches together. Knit 6 stitches. 15 stitches remaining

Row 2: Knit

Row 3: Knit 5 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 5 stitches. 13 stitches remaining

Row 4: Knit

Row 5: Knit 4 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 4 stitches. 11 stitches remaining

Row 6: Knit

Row 7: Knit 3 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 3 stitches. 9 stitches remaining

Row 8: Knit

Row 9: Knit 2 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. 7 stitches remaining

Row 10: Knit

Row 11: Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. 5 stitches remaining

Row 12: Knit

Row 13: Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. 3 stitches remaining

Row 14: Knit

Row 15: Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. 2 stitches remaining

Row 16: Knit

Row 17: Knit the last 2 stitches together.

Row 18: Knit

Before casting off, transfer the last stitch to your crochet hook and crochet a chain long enough for the tie under the chin. This chain should be the same length as the chain you crocheted for the other side.

Cast off.

To make bow on yarn over side: Crochet or knit a 16" chain. (To knit a chain simply knit 1 stitch until your knitting reaches 16".) From the bottom of the casting on side simply weave the ends of the chain in and out of the yarn over spaces, one on each side, to meet at the top of the yarn over's. Pull each side of the string through so that the string is divided evenly in half and leaves no loop on the bottom. You will use these two strings that you have pulled through to tie your bown. Make your pom poms and attach to the chain. Tie chain into a bow.

Make two more pom poms and attach to the bottom of the tie strings (that will tie under the chin).

You are finished!

# Young Girls Ear warmer

For the Young Girls Ear Warmer you will need the following:

- ❖ 2 skeins of worsted weight yarn color of your choice
- ❖ Size 4 or 5 Knitting needles depending on the age of your child (for a child age 3 to 6 use the size 4 needles and a child 7 to 10 use the size 5 knitting needles)
- ❖ Crochet hook that matches the needle you are using for your earwarmer
- ❖ Pom Pom maker or cardboard for making 4 medium pom poms (2 for the ends of the ties and 2 for decorating the bow on the side you made the yarn overs.)

Measure child's head from the tip of the right ear to the tip of the left ear. This will be the length that you will knit the "Middle Section" (from the end of the yarn overs to the beginning of casting off side).

## Casting On Row

Important Note: Before starting to knit, crochet a chain long enough to be one of the tie strings to tie under the chin.

Row 1: After crocheting a long enough chain, transfer the stitch to your knitting needle to begin knitting. This will be Row 1.

Row 2: Knit into your stitch and then place the new stitch onto the original needle. You will now have 2 stitches.

Row 3: Knit

Row 4: Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch You now have 3 stitches

Row 5: Knit

Row 6: Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. You now have 5 stitches

Row 7: Knit

Row 8: Knit 2 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 2 stitch. You now have 7 stitches

Row 9: Knit

Row 10: Knit 3 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 3 stitches. You now have 9 stitches

Row 11: Knit

Row 12: Knit 4 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 4 stitches. You now have 11 stitches

Row 13: Knit

Row 14: Knit 5 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 5 stitches. You now have 13 stitches

Row 15: Knit

Row 16: Knit 6 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 Stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 6 stitches. You now have 15 stitches

Row 17: Knit

Row 18: Knit 7 stitches. Yarn over. Knit 1 Stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 7 stitches. You now have 17 stitches.

Row 19: Knit.

Row 20: Knit 8 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 Stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 8 stitches. You now have 19 stitches.

Row 21: Knit.

Row 22: Knit 9 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 Stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 9 stitches. You now have 21 stitches.

Row 23: Knit

Row 24: Knit 10 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 Stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 10 Stitches. You now have 23 stitches.

Row 25: Knit

Row 26: Knit 11 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 Stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 11 Stitches. You now have 25 stitches.

Row 27: Knit

Row 28: Knit 12 stitches. Yarn Over. Knit 1 Stitch. Yarn Over. Knit 12 Stitches. You now have 27 stitches.

### **Middle Section**

Knit the next section for the measurement that you made of the baby's head from ear to ear. You can either knit it straight (all knitting rows) or you can do a K1 P1 for the measurement of the baby's head. Make sure you end with a knit row.

## **Casting Off Rows**

Row 1: Knit 11 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 11 stitches. You now have 25 stitches.

Row 2: Knit

Row 3: Knit 10 stitches. Knit 2 together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 10 stitches. You now have 23 stitches

Row 4: Knit

Row 5: Knit 9 stitches. Knit 2 together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 9 stitches. You now have 21 stitches

Row 6: Knit

Row 7: Knit 8 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 8 stitches. You now have 19 stitches

Row 8: Knit

Row 9: Knit 7 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 7 stitches. You now have 17 stitches

Row 10: Knit

Row 11: Knit

Row 12: Knit 6 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 6 stitches. You now have 15 stitches

Row 13: Knit

Row 14: Knit 5 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 5 stitches. You now have 13 stitches

Row 15: Knit

Row 16: Knit 4 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 4 stitches. You now have 11 stitches.

Row 17: Knit

Row 18: Knit 3 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 3 stitches. You now have 9 stitches.

Row 19: Knit



Row 20: Knit 2 stitches. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 2 stitches. You now have 7 stitches.

Row 21: Knit

Row 22: Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. You now have 5 stitches

Row 23: Knit

Row 24: Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. You now have 3 stitches.

Row 25: Knit

Row 26: Knit 2 stitches together. Knit 1 stitch. You now have 2 stitches.

Row 27: Knit

Row 28: Knit 2 stitches together. You now have 1 stitch.

Row 29: Knit

Before casting off, transfer the last stitch to your crochet hook and crochet a chain long enough for the tie under the chin. This chain should be the same length as the chain you crocheted for the other side.

Cast off.

To make bow on yarn over side: Crochet or knit a 25" chain. (To knit a chain simply knit 1 stitch until your knitting reaches 16".) From the bottom of the casting on side simply weave the ends of the chain in and out of the yarn over spaces, one on each side, to meet at the top of the yarn over's. Pull each side of the string through so that the string is divided evenly in half and leaves no loop on the bottom. You will use these two strings that you have pulled through to tie your bown. Make your pom poms and attach to the chain. Tie chain into a bow.

Make two more pom poms and attach to the bottom of the tie strings (that will tie under the chin).

You are finished!
